



Yeah, but what can I do???

1) Call your Member of Congress and urge them to sign the Voters First Pledge!

- US PIRG, Public Citizen, Public Campaign, and Common Cause have sent letters to all candidates running for federal office in the 2006 mid-term elections asking them to sign the Pledge to ensure that they'll be **accountable to voters**.
- By calling your incumbent representative, you'll be helping these groups "follow up" on their requests, and you'll add your voice to the steadily growing chorus of those calling out for reform.
- The best time to call is **this upcoming Fourth of July weekend**, when members of Congress will be in recess!
